

ANALYSIS AND RESULT:



Feedback was received from 160 parents. As depicted in the chart provided, the "good" option was predominantly chosen by parents for most of the questions, followed by "very good".

RESULTS BASED ON EACH QUESTIONNAIRE:

1. Do you feel that our teaching approach is adequately effective?

RESULT: The "good" option received the highest rating, with 47.5% of respondents selecting it, followed by 35% choosing "very good". None of the respondents selected "not satisfactory".

2. Your evaluation of the methods used by teachers to ensure that the learning process is sufficiently captivating for students.

RESULT: Once more, the highest rating was achieved by the "good" option, with 48.75% of respondents selecting it, followed by 24.37% choosing "satisfactory".

3. Your perspective on the relationship between teachers and students?

RESULT: 37.5% of parents chose "good," closely followed by 35.62% selecting "very good."

4. Your perspective on the curriculum your child is currently studying.

RESULT: The most prevalent opinion among parents for this question was "Good," with 43.12% of respondents choosing it, followed by 33.75% selecting "very good."

5. Equity in the distribution of grades and in college activities.

RESULT: The majority of parents chose the "good" option, accounting for 48.75%, while 6.25% expressed dissatisfaction by selecting the "not satisfactory" option.

6. Your perspective on our co-curricular activities.

RESULT: In response to this questionnaire, 46.87% of parents selected "Good," while 2.5% chose "Not satisfactory."

7. As parents, do you allocate adequate time for your child to study while at home?

RESULT: Among the five options, 46.87% of parents agreed, marking the highest response, while 19.37% strongly agreed with this question.

8. How would you recommend our college to others?

RESULT: 41.2% of parents selected the "very good" option, while an equal percentage of 26.87% chose both the "excellent" and "good" options.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS AND SUGGESTIONS RECEIVED FROM PARENTS:

Parent feedback indicates overall satisfaction with the college, particularly praising the positive relationship between students and teachers and the dedication of the teaching staff to student welfare and academic success. However, concerns are raised regarding the lack of healthy competition among students, with suggestions for teachers to introduce activities that promote academic improvement and a more structured learning environment. Additionally, there is a call for adjustments to the academic calendar, including later internal exam dates to optimize learning opportunities.

While acknowledging the value of co-curricular activities, some parents express reservations about their potential impact on academic performance and advocate for a reduction in their quantity to ensure a better balance between extracurricular pursuits and academic studies. These insights highlight the importance of maintaining a supportive learning environment while also addressing practical concerns such as transportation and academic scheduling to further enhance the overall educational experience for students and parents alike.
